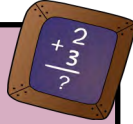


### Maths Learning Development

Children will be using place value and number skills in their own right as well as using them to add and subtract digits.

Children will be learning about fractions. They will use real life skills to find a fraction and then explore an equivalent.

# AN APPLE FOR THE TEACHER



### Thrive/P.H.S.E. Learning Development

Children will spend time getting to know each other and what each other's likes and dislikes are.

They will look into when and where they feel safe and design their own safe space. This will be linked to why a turtle goes into its shell if it senses danger. We will discuss who and what makes us feel safe and what to do if we ever feel unsafe.

Children will also recognise what makes a good friend and what would them a good friend to someone.



### P.E. Learning Development

Children will be practicing their throwing skills and learning about target games such as Boules, Archery, and Quoits.



Children will also have the opportunity to learn about and improve their water safety in the swimming pool.



### Literacy Learning Development

Children will be investigating why we use instructions and why they need to be written in a specific way as well as looking at narrative.

Children will learn to spell age appropriate words accurately including a range of homophones and begin to implement them.



### Outdoor Learning Development

Autumn - Children will learn to be comfortable working and being in outdoor spaces. To understand the changes that autumn weather brings and how to stay safe. To study local wildlife and plants and how they are changing. Children will use the natural environment to make artwork, and build shelters.



### Topic - R.E. and P.H.S.E.

In R.E. children will focusing on different aspects of Christian life from The Creation Story, Jesus' Miracles and Beliefs and Practices. In KS1 they will discuss between right and wrong; what makes them special; in KS2, whether Jesus could really heal people; whether a miracle can actually happen; and in KS3, if they believe God exists.

In P.H.S.E. children will be focussing on being themselves. They will focus on what makes them special, learn about personal identity; what contributes to who we are; to identify personal strengths, skills, achievements and interests and how these contribute to a sense of self-worth as well as to recognise the importance of self-respect and how this can affect their thoughts and feelings about themselves. This will be linked in with looking at British Values.
